Fun Facts

1. The Metro vs. Outstate series is now tied at 15-15. This is the first time the overall series has been tied since 2001.
2. This was the first time since 1996 that an Eden Prairie player did not participate.
3. This was only the second time in 47 All-Star Games that a Minneapolis Conference player did not participate.
4. The Lake Conference has had at least one linebacker in the All-Star Game for 13 straight years.
5. Nine Lake Conference schools were represented in this year's game, tying a record set in 1996 (Twin Cities Suburban) and 2007 (also Lake Conference).
6. This was only the second time (for six class football) that all of the previous season's state championship teams were represented.
7. Luke DeWall became the third place kicker from Stillwater to play in the All-Star Game. Stillwater and Grand Meadow are the only schools to have three kickers in the All-Star Game.
8. Players who have scored more two or more touchdowns in the All-Star Football Game?

24 players: Stephen Johnson (Mahtomedi) and Tyler Swanson (Lakeville North) join this elite list of players who have scored 2 or more TDs.

2009 was only the fourth time that two players scored two TDs in the same game. This is the first time that two Metro players did it. The other years were 1981 (Outstate), 1985 (Outstate) and 1992 (1 Metro, 1 Outstate).

9. Blair Townsend (Coon Rapids) became the fourth player to throw three TD passes. He became the 18th player to throw two or more TD passes.
10. Most players from one conference to score in a single All-Star Game = 3 (1997, Classic Lake Conference and 2009, Lake Conference)

13. 2009 is only that second time that two quarterbacks from the same school district were in the All-Star Game together (James Peterson from Blaine and Blair Townsend from Coon Rapids). The only the year this occurred was 2003 (ISD 196 – Jon Quesnel from Eagan and Anthony Dress from Rosemount).
14. 2009 is the first time that two quarterbacks from the same school district both threw one or more TD passes in the same All-Star Game (Townsend 3 and Peterson 1).

15. Most All-Star Football Games scored in (one school) = 7

16. Most consecutive All-Star Games scored in (one school) = 2 (8 schools)

19. Apple Valley received their 4th All-Star MVP Award – Apple Valley is now tied with Forest Lake for the most MVP awards by school.

20. The Lake Conference has won the last three Metro Defensive MVP awards (Ross Kees 2007, Billy Morgan 2008 and Varmah Sonie 2009 – all ISD 196).
